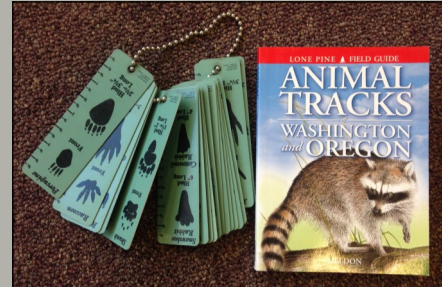


A set of 20 plastic animal stencils allow students to trace and identify tracks.

5) Animal Tracks Literacy Project Lesson Plans by Steve Engel

Objectives - Students (grades 3rd-6th) will be able to use new terminology to describe differences in tracks, accurately measure and record data on a tracks, identify one or more mystery track using a dichotomous key, and predict aspects of the animal's life-style based on their tracks.

This lesson includes all master copies, clear instructions, and high-quality stencils for common Northwest animals. This lesson is a great starting point for literacy projects and student guided inquiry.
