Toxic contaminants are a serious problem in the Columbia River. They degrade habitat, limit species survival, affect human health, and impact our economy. Toxics cause cancer and early exposure damages brain development in children. Contaminants alter hormones that affect the behavior of endangered and threatened salmon species decreasing their survival. Toxics impede economic viability of ports and marinas, and reduce commercial fishing.

There are successes in reducing toxics, and we can build on those. Join the Estuary Partnership and experts from the region as we learn about emerging data and share successes by growers, businesses, and agencies to reduce toxics and chart a course

to do more. It's time to take action. Your voice is important.
