A Bird's Eye View, But Better

Drone will enhance monitoring and data collection



Batwater Station, approximately one year after our habitat restoration project wrapped up.

The Estuary Partnership recently added an unmanned aerial vehicle, or drone, to our science program. The drone will be a helpful tool to enhance monitoring on past and future restoration projects. Our Research Scientist, Matthew Schwartz, obtained his remote pilot certification from the FAA to fly the drone. The drone will help monitor site changes at a high degree of resolution, and its near infrared camera will monitor plant health and plant distribution at sites. This technology will increase the area we can monitor and allow us to create survey grade maps and 3-D surface models. We've linked a quick flyover video of Batwater

Annual MLK Day Tree Planting


"Even if I knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree." – Martin Luther King, Jr.
