## Making a Difference on MLK Day



Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is celebrated across the U.S. as a day to make your community a better place. This year, over 30 volunteers of all ages joined us in the Gorge to plant **870 native ninebark, snowberry, and salmonberry** along the banks of Wahkeena Creek in Benson State Park. Riparian plantings help shade and cool the water to temperatures that support salmon. Plantings are part of a <u>larger habitat restoration</u> **project led by the Estuary Partnership** at

Benson that includes placement of 80 large logs for fish habitat, stormwater treatment for the park's parking lot, and replacement of a water diversion structure to maintain higher, cooler flows through the summer when salmon are most in need of cold water refugia.

It was a fine January day and everybody had a great time. Thanks to the generosity of New Seasons Market, everyone was treated to a tasty lunch. A pileated woodpecker even joined us! A gallery of photos from the day can be found <u>on our</u> Facebook page.
